Anselm McDonnell

Biography

Anselm McDonnell is an Irish/Welsh composer based in Belfast, Northern Ireland. He writes in many different mediums, but the voice - and particularly choral works - is a major part of his output, which currently contains over fifty works for orchestra, chamber ensembles, soloists, choirs, electronics, theatre works and audiovisual material.

McDonnell has written for school choirs, amateur groups, university choirs and professional level ensembles. Several of his compositions have received awards: first prize in the Feis Ceoil Choral Composition Competition 2017 and a selection of pieces was awarded first prize in the Third International Kastalsky Choral Writing Competition. Several choral works have been commissioned, including *Asphyxiate*, commissioned by Choir & Organ for their New Music Series in the Jan/Feb 2019 issue. His pieces have been performed around the world, in Finland, Canada, Russia, Japan, North America and across Europe and the UK. McDonnell has worked with the Chamber Choir Ireland, BBC Singers, C4 Ensemble (New York), St. Salvator's Chapel Choir, Cappella Caeciliana, Cantiunculae, Grosvenor Chorale (where he sings Tenor) and the CMG Vocal Group. *Hinneni*, written under the supervision of Sir James MacMillan as part of the Theoartistry project in St. Andrews University, is available on the *Annunciations* CD from Presto Classical.
